

Formative Research for Adolescent Nutrition Programming in Kenya

Terms of Reference: research assistant/translator – Samburu, Kenya

Role and responsibilities

- 1. Liaise with Anthrologica, WFP Country Office and WFP Sub-Office as required.
- 2. Provide input and national expertise into the adaptation of the research tools, consent forms, information sheets etc.
- 3. Support logistical arrangements for in-country fieldwork and data collection in line with the operational plan and budget as required (this may include arranging travel, arranging vehicle and driver pick-up etc.)
- 4. Work with the Anthrologica research team to conduct data-collection and ensure the quality and validity of the data gathered, including translating during focus groups and interviews.
- 5. Conduct the transcription and translation into English of all data collected.
- 6. Provide input and national expertise into the analysis of the data as required.
- 7. Carry out any county-specific work on the stakeholder mapping exercise as required.

Additional activities may be added as appropriate and required during the period of work.
